Century Fund Establishment and Continuation

In 2015, the FLBCS Board of Trustees established a fund to accept gifts for the purpose of funding full-time faculty positions. FLS was just beginning its next 50 years of operation and FLBC was just completing its first 50 years of operation. The Board of Trustees took action to preserve the core of our institution for the next 50 years, that is, to secure a faculty that is focused on instructing students for future congregational service.

Training servant pastors and equipping students to serve the congregations is essential to what the congregations have asked the College and Seminary to do. The Board of Trustees wants full-time faculty so that they can focus on sharpening their skills in training servant pastors. Having full-time faculty enables them time for on-going curriculum development improving teaching and presentation skills, ensuring all facets of their teaching is fully aligned with the core values of FLBCS. We have established the FLBCS Century Fund to allow the call of full-time faculty positions.

The long term goal of the Board of Trustees is to fund two of these positions outside of operations by endowment. Gifts to the Century Fund have already allowed the Schools to call Dr. Steve Mundfrom, Dr. James Molstre, and Dr. Nathan Olson.
